PARENTS: WHAT'S A WIN? - Steve Sanford

There is so much pressure on parents today to provide all the right opportunities for their children. The list of extra-curricular activities is endless – sports, music, drama, academics – even church. The not-so-subtle message to parents is that it is their duty to provide their children with a broad spectrum of options to maximize the unique potential of each child. The cost in time and treasure to accomplish this can be overwhelming. While none of these things are bad, are they the most important?

This, then, begs the question, "What is a Christian parent's primary responsibility in raising their children?" Is it enough to raise well-adjusted kids, with a good education that will help them get a good job to make a decent living? Or is there a higher calling that trumps these good things?

I'd like to suggest that a true "win" for Christian parents is that their children, most of all, know God, love Him, and desire to live their lives in obedience to Him.

The statistics in this regard are not encouraging. Too many of our students, who have grown-up in the church and make a profession of faith, walk away once they have graduated from high school. In addition, many Christian colleges and seminaries are moving away from an orthodox understanding of the authority of Scripture, and they have shifted to a more pluralistic position - that Jesus is just one of many ways to salvation.

So, how do you know if your son or daughter is spiritually ready to meet the challenges to his/her faith that will inevitably come? Here are some questions you may want to ask them.

What is it that delights or excites you? Why? Do you enjoy God? Is there anything that is hindering you from following Christ? What is the Gospel? Have you decided what you believe? Can you give reasons for the faith you have? (Creation, suffering/evil, inerrancy of Scripture...) Do you understand your world view, and can you help others follow theirs to its logical conclusion?

What do you do if you discover that your daughter or son is not ready? There are a variety of options available, including Nicolet Bible Institute. We exist, among other things, to ground students in their faith – making it their own, to give direction for their future, and to teach them to serve.
