This past fall, a handful of the Nicolet Bible Institute students and a couple of Silver Birch Ranch interns drove from Wisconsin down to Lighthouse Christian Camp in Smithville, TN. While in Neenah, WI, we met up with a team assembled by a group called Faith In Action. Together, our goal was two-fold. The main project was setting up their gymnasium for a Christmas party offered to young girls across several counties in Tennessee. This involved creating gift baskets, sorting endless amounts of clothing, setting up tables, organizing storage rooms, sorting toys, going through school supplies, and more. A second project was to build a large awning/roof over the front door and patio of the gym. The goal was to create a space outside the door for campers to congregate, while still shielded from the weather. All this was to be completed within our nine-day trip.

In the midst of these projects, there were plenty of opportunities for us to see God work. In keeping the construction crew safe while building the roof, God was at work. Even when we had to be up before sunrise, God still gave us energy to work hard and stay motivated in the Christmas party set up. What rose above all this were the relationships that we were able to build. While at Lighthouse we experienced an incredible sense of community in the body of Christ. One of our team members said this: "The relationships built this year were very meaningful and impactful...I cannot express the amount of emotions, laughter, fun, and encouragement that was shared." Another said, "Serving together, laughing together, crying together, even being beyond tired together was just a blessing to see." The camaraderie between us from SBR, those on the Faith in Action team, and staff at Lighthouse was truly something special. All of our hearts are touched in reflection of the time we spent with our brothers and sisters in Christ.

By our trip's end, we finished both our projects earlier than anticipated! Lighthouse Christian Camp has a new roof over its gym door and God pulled off a successful Christmas party with over 400 little girls singing Christmas carols, eating candy, picking out gifts, and hearing the truth of our Savior's birth. We are grateful!
